These events would be very difficult for SIPPS if it were not for the parent volunteers on the day. It was a great day and made even better by the use of our new Gazebos that were the envy of every other school. The P&C purchased these gazebos after the 2022 cross country carnival realising that they are an essential tool when taking kids offsite to sp9orting events. We really did stand out.

School Open Days – Over the last couple of weeks Caroline and I have been looking at what other schools do for their tours and open days (when attracting new enrolments). We have visited a number of schools and had a good look at what they do differently to SIPPS. From these visits we have picked up on some new ideas to help attracting potential enrolments. New Bench – The P&C have managed to provide an additional bench seat for student use which has been placed in the Astro-Turf area near the library. A massive thank you to Don and his Dad who was visiting from South Africa for helping to the bench assembled and in place at the school.

A relatively cheap solution to a lighting problem at night. The solar powered lights come on in the dark and charge up during the day.

It certainly makes the area look very magical and special indeed. Huge thanks to all involved and special thanks to Don for the use of his ute to help get them installed.





Solar Project update – It is exciting news with regards to the Solar My School project. SIPPS is one step closer to achieving this huge goal. At the end of May we received notification from the Purryburry Trust that our matched funding grant had been successful. The P&FC still need to find the \$4,250 from our fundraising kitty to complete the project, but this is a big step forward. The next stage is to get the department of education assets team to go to tender for the work. I am still hopeful that this will happen quickly and we will have the solar in and working before the end of 2023.

Video work - The new SIPPS difference video is now live and it appears to have had a great result. Massive thanks to all P&C volunteers who have been involved in this.
